



Pool Hire Contract – Conditions of Use

Use and private hire of the Heckington Community Swimming Pool is subject to knowledge, acceptance and compliance with the Admissions Policy and Poolside Rules which form part of this contract, together with any other specific guidance or information given below.

Heckington Community Swimming Pool Committee holds overall responsibility for Health and Safety and maintenance of the pool site, pool, boundaries and buildings, fixtures and fittings.

You the Hirer/User hold overall responsibility for the behaviour and general wellbeing of pool users and guests.

Poolside Rules for all pool users and spectators must be adhered to at all times. Pool property, equipment and provisions to be respected and used according to their designated use.

You the Hirer/User must ensure enough adults (over 16yrs) are present to provide acceptable supervision of children in accordance with Admission Policy guidelines.

Heckington Community Swimming Pool Committee will provide a Poolside Supervisor with current certified basic Lifesaver skills for all private hire and community swimming sessions.

The Poolside Supervisors guidance, safety and evacuation instructions must be respected and followed at all times.

The Committee to be made aware of any known health issues that may require additional Poolside supervision; for example, hearing or visual loss, epilepsy.

You the Hirer/User will be responsible for any catering you bring to the pool, including the disposal of food and other waste.

Admission Policy

- No more than 28 people in the pool at any one time.
- Poolside Rules identifying behaviour standards and poolside safety notices must be adhered to at all times.
- The Poolside Supervisors guidance, safety and evacuation instructions must be respected and followed at all times.
- All infants (8 years and under) and non-swimming juniors MUST be accompanied by a responsible adult whilst on the pool site, with all children under 5 years old accompanied in the water by that responsible adult. SEE SPECIFIC GUIDANCE BELOW.
- All children 8 years and under MUST wear armbands complying with EN BS 13138 or have an ASA/ISRM swim award
 - 1 Adult may supervise up to 2 under 4 year old children, if they both have armbands that comply or an acceptable swim award.
 - 1 Adult may supervise up to 3 under 7 year old children, if they have armbands that comply or an acceptable swim award.
 - 1 Adult may supervise up to 1 child under 4 and two children under 7 years old, if they have armbands that comply or an acceptable swim award.
 - 2 Adults may supervise up to 4 under 4 year old children, if they have armbands that comply or an acceptable swim award.
 - 2 Adults may supervise up to 6 under 7 year old children, if they have armbands that comply or an acceptable swim award.
 - 2 Adults may supervise up to 2 under 4 year old children and 3 under 7 year olds , if they have armbands that comply or a swim award
 - 2 Adults may supervise up to 3 under 4 year old children and 2 under 7 year olds, if they have armbands that comply or a swim award.

Poolside Rules

- Admission to school premises is restricted to the pool entrance enclosure only – no access through the gates to playground.
- Maximum number allowed in the pool at one time is 28.
- One or more Committee members present when the pool is in use, to ensure responsible behaviour by pool users and to provide Lifesaver skills.
- Children 8 years and under and all non swimming children MUST wear approved arm bands or hold an appropriate swim award and MUST be accompanied by a responsible adult
- Regular swimming sessions restricted to children up to year 7.
- No DIVING or JUMPING into the pool.
- No RUNNING within the pool enclosure.
- No rubber rings allowed unless worn with armbands.
- Long hair MUST be tied up- swimming hats preferable.
- Jewellery not to be worn by swimmers.
- Non toilet trained infants MUST wear waterproof swim nappy.
- No swimming for 2 weeks following bout of sickness and diarrhoea

In the event of emergency two short blasts of the whistle will be sounded. Please respond calmly to any instructions given by the pool supervisor.
